Social Programs/ groups to use for Demand Model

Categories listed in “Workbook for Estimating Demand for Rural Transportation”: Chapter 1, pg. 7:

1. The existence or planned implementation of social programs serving residents of the area under study, such as

- Developmental services: adult;
- Developmental services: case management;
- Developmental services: children;
- Developmental services: pre-school;
- Group homes;
- Headstart;
- Headstart: home base;
- Headstart: other;
- Homeless transportation;
- Job training;
- Mental health services;
- Mental health services: case management;
- Nursing homes;
- Senior nutrition;
- Shelter workshops; and
- Substance abuse.

Additional users/ comments from Local Demand Team:

- We also need to look at general groups too.
- Group Homes – most travel is provided by home owners. May not be helpful numbers to use.

Other groups to consider in the demand model for this feasibility study such as:

- Disabled living with relatives or in household – data from Independent Living Centers.
- College students.
- Commuters.
- Large Employment centers.
- Penal system inmates that will be getting released soon: Jails and prisons. Work Camps.
- Drug Court: those that have lost licenses.
- Medical: getting back home.
- Park Staff (Seasonal employees of National Parks).
- Seasonal Workers in larger city areas. Jackson, Cody, West Yellowstone.
- Low income / limited transportation.
- Transitional Agricultural employees.
- General public.
- Tourist and recreationalists- those already here, moving around locally or town to town.
- Tribal Governments.
- Veterans.
